BOURNE – A summer resort area bounded on the north by Plymouth, on the south by Falmouth, on the east by Sandwich, and on the west by the waters of Buzzards Bay. The town, which is divided in two by the Cape Cod Canal, is comprised of the villages of Buzzards Bay, Bournedale, Sagamore Beach, and Sagamore on the north side of the Cape Cod Canal, and Sagamore, Bourne, Gray Gables, Monument Beach, Pocasset and Cataumet on the south side. Part of Otis Air National Guard Base is also in the town of Bourne. The winter population numbers 20,351 with summer population estimated at 40,000.
